Post-Doctoral Fellowship in Mental Health Services Research

McLean Hospital, an affiliate of Harvard Medical School, is offering advanced training in clinical research focused on early psychosis to individuals who have already completed all requirements for PhD, MD, or other relevant doctoral degrees in epidemiology, psychiatry, public health, or other related fields. This training is supported by the National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH) through the Advanced Laboratories for Accelerating the Reach and Impact of Treatments for Youth and Adults with Mental Illness (ALACRITY) and Early Psychosis Intervention Network (EPINET) programs. Fellows accepted for enrollment enter the fellowship program for periods of up to two years, depending on the nature of their chosen areas of interest and the time required for the kind of project activity they identify in conjunction with a program mentor.

Training emphasizes the organization, delivery, utilization, and quality of care for individuals experiencing early phases of a psychotic disorder and on the methods needed for such work. The program provides experience in a well-funded research environment with excellent opportunities for faculty collaboration and publication. We have funding for two post-docs each year.
